Materials Needed



Two # 31/2 & two # 4 race = four nails, Wire, Neck Cord, Super glue, Sealer, Paper clip, Paper towel, Disposable Latex Gloves and small plastic bags. **(see Suppliers)**

Latex Gloves: **(see Tips)**

Tools Needed



I use 2-large, 2-medium, and 1- small pair of vice-grips, 1-Square nose pliers, 1-Needle-nose pliers, **Cont'd >>>**

1-Curved Dental Needle-nose-pliers, 1-Small Computer Wire snips, 1-Paper Punch, and a small square piece of wood

I purchased all of the tools at a local Hardware Store except the wire snips that came from Radio Shack. *(They came in economy packs)*

Many of these tools are not necessary but make it a lot more convenient, especially if you plan to make a lot of crosses. You can get by with a single pair of vice grips, small needle nose pliers, large flat end pliers and a piece of wood. You may be able to use nail clippers to cut the wire depending on the gauge that you choose to use.

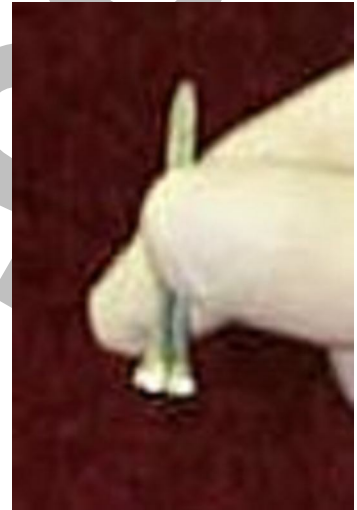
Throughout this ebook, I refer to the lower part of the cross as the “leg”, the portion that sticks out on each side as the “arms”, and the upper portion as the “neck”.

(Section A) Making the "Neck"

View may be reversed depending on the hand you are using

1. Begin by pairing up the two #4 nails. *(I use a larger nail to make big loops to allow for a thick cord such as leather. You can use 3.5 nails and use thinner necklace cords if you wish however your measurements will need to be modified.)*

Tip: the nails in the box vary slightly in length; just enough to make the cross lop-sided. Be sure to match them closely



2. Stick the point of one of the larger nails into the needle nose pliers, even with the tip of the third tooth
